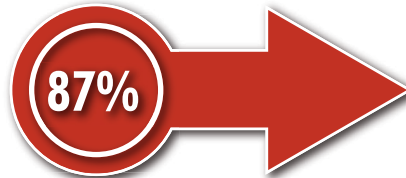


These percentages indicate the proportion of 803 respondents who gave favourable ratings to companies that do the following:
